Notification must be communicated to the Coordinator a minimum of 5 business days prior to filming. Submit to: film@canmore.ca. Submission of this notice does not guarantee availability or approval of project, location, time or date.

All required supporting documentation must be provided to the Film Permitting Coordinator when Notice of Scheduled Filming is submitted.

Exemptions from an Annual Film Permit Agreement:

Projects of the following nature are ineligible under the Annual Film Permit Agreement and a Notice of Scheduled Filming will not be accepted. Seek guidance from the Coordinator on required permits.

- Feature or television films
- Television programs/series
- Documentaries
- Educational films/programs
- Multi-day filming projects
- Requires reserved parking
- Use of a UAV (drones)Any film production that requires a crew of 7 or more people
- Any film production that includes the use of firearms, fire or pyrotechnic effects, and/or any other special effect
- Road closures partial or full and includes the closure of streets, alleys, lanes and/or sidewalks for filming activities
- Construction or erecting of tents, sets, or props

The aforementioned ineligible projects require a full film permit (regular permit or UAV permit) application submitted to the Coordinator a minimum of 10 business days in advance of filming.
